Juvenile Law Analysis & Expungement Update

COURSE CONTENT: This presentation will feature an analysis of the most recent changes Illinois Juvenile Justice Law concerning the Expungement and/or sealing of documents pertaining to Juveniles in the possession of Law Enforcement Agencies.

Included will be an overview of the current Illinois Juvenile Court Act with respect to Arrests, Interrogations, Chargeable Offenses, Sentencing and Maintenance of Records concerning Juveniles. The latest legislative amendments concerning Juvenile Justice will be listed and analyzed.

Topics will also include changes in adult prosecutions for minors; sex offender registration changes for minors; and changes in the age requirements for minors to be treated as juveniles. Additionally, the latest case law concerning Juvenile Justice will be listed and analyzed.

Instructor: Donald L. Hays, Illinois Prosecutor Services. For 30 years, Mr. Hays was the Senior Counsel for the Office of the Appellate Prosecutor. As Senior Counsel, he was in charge of the Continuing Legal Education programs for that office. For the past 25 years, Mr. Hays has trained prosecutors and law enforcement officers for the Office of the Appellate Prosecutor and for various Mobile Team Units in Illinois. Since retiring from state employment in 2009, Mr. Hays has authored the Illinois Criminal Offense Guide; the Juvenile Justice Case Digest; the Juvenile Justice Quarterly, and numerous other publications.

Law Updates Use of Force (must include scenario based or similar approved)

Mandated once every 3 years (begin 1/1/16)

Civil Rights **Constitutional and proper use of law enforcement authority**

Cultural competency **Procedural Justice** Human Rights

Mandated once every 3 years (begin 1/1/17 all / within 2 yrs. for investigators)

Trauma Informed Response & Investigation of Sexual Assault & Abuse

Mandated once every 3 years (begin 1/1/18)

Mental Health Awareness

Mandated 32 hours every 4 years after initial training

Lead Homicide Investigator training

Mandated once every 5 years /begin 7/1/18 (first (5) year cycle due by 1/1/2020)

Domestic Violence Act.
