### Hazardous Materials Awareness

This training fulfills the requirement of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and United States Environmental Protection Agency (OSHA/USEPA) final rule for emergency response personnel who may be the first on-the-scene at a hazardous materials incident. This course is directed to law enforcement officers.

The Illinois Department of Labor enforces the rules within all state, county and municipal work sites. **This is mandatory training** and non-compliance can result in citation and fine under the Illinois Department of Labor rules.

### COURSE OBJECTIVES

- ✓ Identify the risks associated with hazardous materials.
- ✓ Recognize and identify hazardous materials using several different methods.
- ✓ Define the law enforcement officer’s role as first-on-the-scene.
- ✓ Organize essential information into a plan knowing who to call for assistance.
- ✓ Better understand the decision-making associated with hazardous materials Emergency response
