PURPOSE OF COURSE: This two-day course has been designed to meet the practical needs of the uniformed patrol officer who has supervisory responsibilities.

COURSE OVERVIEW: This program will challenge the Officers-in-Charge and Field Training Officer to evaluate their leadership styles within the context of the patrol setting. Management of numerous patrol challenges will be discussed within a highly interactive setting. Safe and proper responses to these situations will be particularly stressed.

COURSE COALS: The main goal of this course is to provide a forum in which students may evaluate their personal leadership styles as well as their responses to various patrol challenges faced by the Officers in Charge.

COURSE PREREQUISITES: This course will be offered to sworn and non-sworn personnel or law enforcement, sheriffs, and public safety agencies.

M.ETHODS OF EVALUATION: Students will be required to demonstrate knowledge or all course materials. Additionally, the instructor will evaluate students' comprehension and retention of course topics based on their participation in practical exercise scenarios and discussions conducted during the course. Evaluation forms completed by each student will provide feedback to the instructor.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION: This course is conducted using the following methods of instruction:

- In-class review of student handout materials.
- In-class written self-assessment instrument
- In-class lecture
- In-class video presentations
- In-class general discussion

The proposed training program is intended for a minimum of 20 participants and a maximum of 45 participants. All course materials will be provided by the local training unit.
