- 7-5 Peace officer's use of force in making arrest.
- 7-5.5 Prohibited use of force by a peace officer.
- 7-6 Private person's use of force in making arrest.
- 7-8 Force likely to cause death or great bodily harm.
- 7-9 Use of force to prevent escape.
- 7-15 Duty to render aid.
- 7-16 Duty to intervene.

Constitutional Amendments

- Reasonable Use of Force (Federal and Illinois)
- Excessive Use of Force (Constitutional and Statutory)
- Protection of the United States Constitution (4th and 8th Amendments)
- Due Process (14th Amendment)



- Search Warrants (725 ILCS 5/108-1 etc.)
- Investigative (Terry) Stops. (725 ILCS 5/107-14). Temporary questioning without arrest
- Ethical Issues (Law Enforcement Certification/Decertification)
- Civil Liability (Qualified Immunity Federal and Illinois)
